

The Official Pattern of Dish Rag Tag V V is for Victory

Materials

1 ball of worsted cotton, a pair of straight needles in an appropriate size, yarn needle, a stitch marker (optional but easier if you don't care to count stitches)

Notes:

*When instructed to TURN, rotate the entire piece (mid-row) so that the back becomes the front. Move the working yarn between the needles to the appropriate place and continue with the row.

*YO – Yarn Over

*See Page 2 for row by row pattern instructions if you prefer them.

*Abbreviations are standard.

Cast on 15

K3, place marker (these three stitches are the outside border), K to end

Row 1: K2TOG, YO, K to end (outside edge)

Row 2: Knit to YO, TURN

Repeat the above two rows until the YO on Row 1 is next to the stitch marker. (last row is worked as K2TOG, YO, K3 and you will have 6 YOs on the LH needle)

Next: K to end (center)

Repeat these instructions 13 more times for a total of 14 chunks and eyelet rows.

Bind off back to the outside edge. Break yarn leaving a 12 inch tail.

With the yarn tail and needle, sew the cast on and bound off edges together to form a circle. When you reach the center, weave the yarn through the stitches around the inner edge of the dish cloth. Pull the yarn tail, gathering the center stitches together and closing the hole a bit. Secure and hide all remaining yarn tails.

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Materials

the cotton in the box, a pair of straight needles in an appropriate size, yarn needle, a stitch marker (optional but easier if you don't care to count stitches)

Cast on 15

Row 1: K3, place marker (these three stitches are the outside border), K to end

Row 2: K2TOG, YO, K to end (even rows will end at the outside edge)

Row 3: K13, TURN

Row 4: K2TOG, YO, K to end

Row 5: K11, TURN

Row 6: K2TOG, YO, K to end

Row 7: K9, TURN

Row 8: K2TOG, YO, K to end

Row 9: K7, TURN

Row 10: K2TOG, YO, K to end

Row 11: K5, TURN

Row 12: K2TOG, YO, K to end (YO will be immediately before marker)

Row 13: Knit to end (you will end at the center)

Repeat Rows 2–13 thirteen more times for a total of 14 chunks and eyelet rows.

Bind off back to the outside edge. Break yarn leaving a 12 inch tail.

With the yarn tail and needle, sew the cast on and bound off edges together to form a circle. When you reach the center, weave the yarn through the stitches around the inner edge of the dish cloth. Pull the yarn tail, gathering the center stitches together and closing the hole a bit. Secure and hide all remaining yarn tails.

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
